Who are the protagonist(s) and antagonist(s) of the story (R100/106)? **Do any of the characters encounter a conflict? If so, what kind, and with who?**

What is the theme of the story? (Remember some stories may contain multiple themes. If this is the case, select the one that was most important in your opinion.) **Can you apply this message to your personal life?** (MLL R109, 304-309).

Reading Comprehension Task: Create a plot diagram of your novel on a separate sheet of paper (MLL pg 26). Presentation is important, so use a sheet of copy paper. Do not forget to head this page with the appropriate label-name, period, etc (on the back). Extra points will be awarded to project quality diagrams.

Extra credit: *Option 1*) Recreate your novel's book cover, or design a movie poster for your book. The book cover/movie poster should show a central event of the plot, or a main theme of the story without giving away the ending (You can view examples in the “**More Great Reads**” sections at the end of each unit in your literature book-MLL pg 172 300, 434,538, 622,750, 864, 962). ***Option 2***) Create a book jacket for your novel. You may use any media to complete this project (paints, colored pencils, markers, photography/pictures, or collages. However, your project cannot be on notebook paper, or in pencil). Remember, your work represents you; **DO NOT TURN IN ANYTHING OTHER THAN YOUR BEST!**
