**Option 1:** A film production company has decided to create a theatrical rendition of Ray Bradbury's short story "Kaleidoscope." 




**Option 2:** McDougal Littell Literature has decided to include "Kaleidoscope," a short story by Ray Bradbury, in their newest literature textbook for eighth graders. However, they still need an illustrated cover that accurately represents Bradbury's literary work. If you can successfully produce a cover for "Kaleidoscope," you will receive 100 points that can replace any zero received for a second semester classwork/homework assignment. **Due**: May 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023







Option 3: A collector is looking for artistic pictures that portray scenes from Ray Bradbury's short story "Kaleidoscope." This task should be completed on poster board (worth 200 points) or canvas/ceiling tile (worth 300 points). Remember, the collector is only looking for pieces that can be displayed. Artistry and quality are key. In exchange for your hard work, the points can be used to replace any zero received for a second semester classwork/homework assignment. **Option 4:** In the upcoming month, *The Atlanta Journal Constitution* would like to do a tribute to a variety of famous American authors. They have selected Ray Bradbury to represent the science-fiction genre. Currently, they are searching for comic strips about Bradbury's short story "Kaleidoscope." If selected, your work will be published in their Sunday paper. Your comic strip can present the complete story, or simply illustrate your favorite scene. They will focus on design, organization, artistry, and content.
